# SET IN STONE Visual softness and texture were behind the choice of marble for this prep space

## the brief

Owned by a Sydney family, this kitchen lacked the period detail that the rest of the house enjoyed. Danielle Bonello-Dunsford took up the challenge of restoring some of that to the kitchen and butler's pantry while also creating a lighter, larger, more functional space. She pinched a few metres from an adjacent bedroom, blocked off a window with a clothesline view and oriented the new windows and skylights to the north.

## the design

"Adding a new VJ panelled bulkhead to the ceiling defines the kitchen zone," says Danielle, who chose leathered Super White Dolomite marble for the surfaces underneath. "Its textured veins add luxury and fill the volume of the space so well." Danielle Victoria Design is at daniellevictoria.com.au

#### the colour scheme

Danielle selected Dulux Lyttelton Half for the cabinetry in the main part of the kitchen and then complemented it with Dulux Sepal in the bar servery and butler's pantry – both great with the wooden floor.
